What happens if a child is unwell?

- If your child has COVID-19 symptoms (https://www.nhs.uk/conditions/coronavirus-covid-19/symptoms/), we expect you to telephone 111 for NHS support. Do not send your child into school.
- If your child develops symptoms at school, we will contact parents and expect them to be collected immediately and telephone 111 for NHS support.
- If a child has a positive COVID-19 test, we will liaise with Public Health England and follow the advice, which may mean that not only the child who tested positive isolates for 10 days but the whole class bubble, including the staff, for 14 days.

If a whole class bubble needs to be sent home, the school will lead the education. We hope to confirm this week, if not prompted beforehand, and to share the arrangements for how we will support educating your child at home. Our initial plans will include a blend of the class blogs with live lessons via Microsoft Teams. Logins for Microsoft are currently being organised by colleagues within the CLF.

If your child is unwell for any other reason please remember to ring the school office daily to keep the school updated.
