In the Learning: Here are some images from this week reflecting the experiences and opportunities that have supported children's learning this past week.






Reception children have explored Space this week with the Space Experts at the Explorer Dome and in their own role-play.



In Year 1, the week started off with children coming into school in their pyjamas and sharing their favourite bedtime books.




Year 2 scientists have been learning all about bones.
