Reception had an incredible day at Bristol Aquarium. They went on a guided tour and saw some incredible sea animals.




This term, as scientists, Year 1 are exploring magnetic materials.




Year 2 musicians enjoyed their first of 5 sessions exploring steel pan drumming. Thank you to the West of England Music Association.
