Excellent reading outcomes

The reading challenge of trying to read as much as possible is having a tremendous impact on those reading daily:

- Regular reading is helping children to enjoy their books.

- Pupils' vocabulary is improving in their talking and their writing.

- Our younger readers are using their taught phonics and recognising more common exception words (not phonics).

- Year 5 Pine class continue to win the Key Stage challenge, with each pupil recording an average of 6 reads per week!
- Year 1 Cherry Class recorded an average of 7 reads per week!
