Safeguarding all families

We would like to remind all parents that should there be disagreements between parents, that these are resolved off the school site and ideally beyond the eyes and ears of children. Should incidents of inappropriate behaviour, including profanity (swearing, abusive language, socially offensive use of language) be repeated, the school may consider options including police involvement, formal warnings and site bans.
