Thank you for your support as every day counts

We enter the 13th week since the start of the school year, it is clear that it has been a tremendously trying time for everyone. I want to thank all parents for your respect, patience and support for our team. You clearly recognise the challenges our staff face, in addition to the already challenging role that teaching is.

Despite these challenges, we can be really proud of the standards of teaching and learning our teaching teams are ambitiously aiming to deliver. It is very clear following internal school reviews and visits from colleagues within the Cabot Learning Federation that so many children are progressing well. Every day counts.

COVID-19 Secure

Despite the 2 isolated positive adult cases in school staff, it is very clear that our controls and your efforts are helping to ensure children and staff can attend school safely. We have a number of controls in place and these are proving impactful. We currently have 96-98.5% attendance in all classes.

- Cleaning throughout the day.
- A cleaner between 11 2pm cleaning common touch points.
- Class bubbles in designated play spaces.
- Face masks worn by staff greeting parents.

You are also playing your part! Please keep up...

- Distancing between adults and children not in the same bubbles.
- → Wearing masks when walking to school.

A further reminder.... We have had a number of parents mention concerns about children playing together outside of school and spending time close to each other despite not being in the same 'bubble'. Our "bubble" system is designed to minimise the number of children we would need to ask to isolate in this case. We need parents to consider this 'mixing' and any unmonitored play outside, especially with the older children, as we remain in a national lockdown and will be in **Tier 3** from next week.
