It has been great to see the children returning to school after a much-deserved Easter/Spring break. Whilst we all enjoyed a break of routine, our team feel they are well placed to support the children to have what they need over the next two terms.

Attendance is high and we know that when children are in school on time (8:40 - 9:00 am), this helps them be ready for learning as they greet their friends and teachers, find out the plan for the day and start their reading lessons.

Face masks/face coverings and...

Last Monday, we shared that facemasks were something parents could choose to wear when they came onto the school playground at collection and drop-off time. This is in line with government guidance. However, please remember that if you choose not to wear a mask/face covering, you should be maintaining 2 metre distancing. Wearing a mask is part of the '1 metre plus' approach. Until a

further update from the Government expected on the 17th May, we thank families in advance for their patience and respect of our current approaches:



- social distancing
- pupils working in class bubbles
- limited items brought into school after registration
- punctual drop-off and collections
- limited meetings with parents in person
- regular hand sanitation

safety, we are trying to organise for the Police and a mobile network provider to offer parent support (online workshop) for parental settings and security. We will update you as soon as possible.

Catch-up subscriptions – BugClub & Doodle

There are 5 weeks until the next break with 2 bank holidays in between. After this, there will be another 6 weeks. During this time, you could help your child to access a range of school paid subscriptions to help them be more secure in their English and Maths knowledge and skills.

BugClub – daily reading books beyond the physical books that are changed weekly. Your children can access Doodle Maths, Doodle Tables, Doodle English and Doodle Spellings. All the Doodle programmes ask the children a series of questions and update your child's personal challenges based on their answers.

Daily practise (5-10 minutes) on one of these programmes on separate nights will consolidate and improve basic knowledge recall.
