Please take time to remind yourself of the school uniform policy. We understand that there are times when uniform cannot be replaced immediately. However, we have seen an increase of children, particularly in Years 4 – 6, wearing tight black leggings, tracksuit bottoms on non-PE days and non-black trainers. The uniform policy specifies grey trousers or skirts, black or navy tracksuit on PE days, all-black trainers or black shoes on non-PE days and sports trainers, including all black, on PE days.

Please be aware that staff will contact families to hold conversations to ensure the policy is followed and, should we need to, parents should expect to be called in the school day to bring in correct uniform. Where the school believes there is deliberate disregard for the school policy, this may result in behavioural consequences outlined in the behaviour policy.

Universal support for our families

At times, families may need support to ensure they can thrive and are making the most of family life. At HVA, we offer all our families 'universal support' in many ways, through our Inclusion Team, such as: strong teacher/parent relationships, family support work with Mrs Saunter, monthly coffee mornings, food bank parcels from school and the Weston Food Bank, Family links parenting groups, reconnecting relationships work, and 1:1 parent meetings to explore what's working well, what's not working so well and what could be different.

As well as the above, we are able to signpost families to 'additonal support', which may include referrals to another agency for extra help with the issues that a family may be facing. Early Help can come from any of the support services in your community which support you with things like:

- Parenting
- family relationships
- childcare
- mental and physical health
- special educational needs and disabilities (SEND) support
- housing
- money
- employment
- social care
- education

every Saturday from 10:00am to 1:00pm at Broadoak Academy for a smashing time! See flyer attached.


In the learning...
