

Supporting Key Workers

Haywood Village Academy will now be used as a 'Hub' centre for children of Key Workers from CLF academies: Hans Price, Broadoak, Uphill Village and Haywood Village. HVA staff, including senior leaders, will be part of the weekly rota to support the children.

Free School Meals

We have received several enquiries regarding free school meals. There is wide confusion around this and this was further compounded by incorrect communication from the Department of Education to one our own parents this week.

All children in Reception, Year 1 and 2 receive what is known as Universal Infant Free School Meals (UIFSM).

Some children across the school, included those in Reception, Year 1 and 2 are from families in receipt of particular government financial benefits. These families would be entitled to free school meals, even if the government did not offer a UIFSM. Children in Year 3 and above, from families in receipt of particular government financial benefits, are entitled to a free school meal.

The government confirmed that they are not providing families, during closure, with their child's Universal Infant Free School Meal (UIFSM). They are only providing a free school meal or vouchers to those families who are known to the school, who are currently in receipt of particular government financial benefits.
