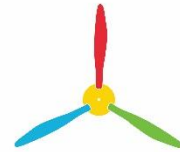

School Uniform Policy

1. Rationale

We pride ourselves on all of our achievements at Haywood Village Academy. Our pride in our school extends from our school uniform. A school uniform provides many benefits linked to safeguarding, community unity, reduced pressure for clothing decisions in the morning, cost, pride in personal appearance and self-esteem. This policy has been developed in accordance with guidance from Department for Education.

We expect and appreciate parental cooperation in ensuring that all children come to school dressed appropriately. By wearing the school uniform, children and families are supporting school policies and this sends an important message to children around respecting and adhering to rules and expectations.

2. Uniform

- Royal blue crew neck sweatshirt/ jumper/cardigan
- Turquoise polo shirt (embroidered school logo is optional but preferred)
- Grey trousers/shorts, pinafore dress or skirt, blue checked (Gingham) summer dress
- Black, grey or navy socks or navy or grey tights.
- Suitable black footwear – shoes or trainers (not high boots) – See section 5.
- Key Stage 1 & Y3: Royal blue book bag (large bags /satchels will not be accepted due to storage limitations).
- Year 4,5,6: Own school bags size: 30cm width x 40cm height (Larger bags can not be accommodated due to storage).
- PE kit can be worn on identified PE days for Year 1-6. The school will communicate these days with parents. Reception to bring PE kits and change in school.
- Year 6 'Leavers' hoodies can be worn for PE only.

3. P.E kit

- Royal blue T-shirt and plain shorts: royal blue, navy or black shorts for PE
- Pupils can wear short leggings: royal blue, navy or black shorts for PE
- Navy or black tracksuit/legging trousers can also be worn instead of shorts
- Pupils can wear Royal blue PE Hoodies
- Sports trainers are needed for PE
- A labelled royal blue drawstring bag
- Swimming: Close fitting swimwear: trunks or single piece costume) and a swim-cap. This is not required for Reception children.
- Long hair will need to be 'tied up' with the use of hairbands.
- Year 6 'Leavers' hoodies can be worn for PE only.

4. Expectations

4.1 It is expected that school uniform will be worn daily unless parents have provided notice to the school for reasonable exemptions.

4.2 The school will contact families to ensure the policy is followed, and should it be required, parents should expect to be contacted in the school day to bring in

correct uniform. Should a child attend school in the incorrect uniform, a further option the school may choose is to provide the correct school uniform for the child to change into for the duration of the school day.

- 4.3 Where the school believes there is deliberate disregard for the school policy by pupils, this may result in behavioural consequences outlined in the behaviour policy.
- 4.4 All clothing and bags should be clearly marked with a child's name.
- 4.5 Pupils may be exempt from wearing school uniform if the school deems it appropriate to wear more suitable clothing e.g. outdoor clothing for forest school activities. The school will provide parents notice of a change to uniform.
- 4.6 On school trips, unless the school states otherwise, it will be expected that the pupils will wear a school logo jumper or polo shirt.
- 4.7 The school will provide a main supplier for the uniform, and this can be signposted from the school's website. Second-hand uniform is available on request from the school office.
- 4.8 Hair & Accessories: The school recognises that pupils' hair is personal to them. The school welcomes families to support their child to have an individual hair style whilst considering its appropriateness to the learning environment. This includes appropriate hair accessories.
- 4.9 Jewellery: Earrings can be stud earrings only and will need to be covered/taped over for PE. Necklaces can be worn but should be underneath clothing and removed for PE. Oversize necklaces should not be worn. Children should not be wearing rings to school.
- 4.10 Make-up: No make-up is permissible in school. This included painted and artificial nails, artificial eyewear e.g. eyelash extensions.
- 4.11 Watches: Wrist watches can be worn to school. Where these watches have the capability to interact and receive notifications, these settings should be switched off in school day hours 8:45 – 3:20
- 4.12 Pupil phones can be brought into school for children between Year 4 and Year 6. These must be handed in to Class Teachers for safe and secure storage from registration until the end of the school day. Phones will not be accessible for pupil use in the school day.
